



We have also created some beautiful artwork based on some of the fairy tales we have read. Our favourite story so far is the Three Little Pigs.





Last week, 1C read the book "Stuck" by Oliver Jeffers. In the book, a young boy gets his kite stuck in a tree and decides to try to get it out by throwing various objects at it. He throws his shoe then it too gets stuck! He throws his other shoe - stuck! So, he throws a door, an orang-utan, a boat and even a whale but they all get stuck in the tree too! In the end, he finally throws a saw up into the tree which knocks his kite down. Everything else is left in the tree though!





1C's task was to design something that could collect all the objects and animals from the tree safely and easily. We first planned our designs in groups and wrote a list of materials we will need. Year 6 Excursion to Canberra

Last Wednesday, students in Year 6 arrived at school early to attend their excursion to Canberra. Our first stop was in Goulburn for morning tea where students explored the gardens, played games and had their recess before returning to the bus bound for Canberra.



Arriving in Canberra at 12.30pm, we had a quick lunch stop outside Parliament House before our first attraction visit. After passing through the security entrance, we were led through the foyer of Parliament House to a meeting with our Federal Member for Bennelong, Mr John Alexander. He spoke about his career and answered questions put forward about current political situations by our students. Following this, we listened in on the sitting House of Representatives before visiting the Senate and discussing the role and features of each house. We then lined up for a chance to view Question Time where students were engaged while watching the lively questions without notice.

After a snack at hospitality and a viewing of the Lego Parliament House exhibit, we returned to the bus and drove to the Mount Ainslie Lookout. This allowed students to view Canberra from the lookout and see the following day's destinations of the War Memorial, Questacon and the National Museum from above.

After viewing Canberra from the lookout, we travelled to our accommodation at the Ibis Eagle Hawk Resort where we split into cabins before enjoying dinner, trivia games and a Beatles singalong.





Another early start on Thursday was the beginning of an action packed and very full day with four attractions visited. Arriving promptly at the War Memorial, we explored the outdoor monuments before attending our guided tours of the exhibits for the *We Will Remember Them* program. Students visited the Roll of Honour, Hall of Memory, Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and various galleries within the Memorial including the G for George multimedia show. Our student leaders, Dominic, Nikkita, Joohee and Josh, led a wreath laying ceremony while students reflected on the efforts of our soldiers and remembered the sacrifice of all ANZACs for Australia. We were also fortunate to have a presentation from an Australian veteran who shared his story as well as war experiences of other members of his family.













We then excitedly boarded the bus for our short trip to Questacon. Many students enjoyed the free fall where they climbed a staircase to an exciting drop of about 6 metres onto a slide. Science experiments, building activities and light, sound and tactile galleries provided the chance for students to explore scientific ideas in a hands-on and interactive way.













We continued on to the National Museum of Australia where we participated in both a guided tour through the *Meet the People* program and a self-guided exploration of the galleries, allowing students to engage with many parts of the museum.







We returned to our accommodation for dinner before we were back on the bus and headed to the Australian National Botanic Gardens. A night tour searching for

traces of animal life within the gardens provided glimpses of kangaroos, tawny frogmouths, possums, frogs, lizards and a variety of other wildlife. After an exciting, educational and tiring day, we returned to our cabins for a good night's sleep.

During our final morning we visited the Electoral Education Centre to learn about voting in Australia before strolling through the rose gardens opposite Old Parliament House. We waved goodbye to Canberra after a lunch break outside Questacon and were back on the bus bound for Sydney.





The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion, the Australian Government has contributed funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. This rebate has already been deducted, reducing the total cost charged.

Our Year 6 students are to be commended for representing Kent Road so well during the excursion. There were many comments about students' respectful behaviour, curious questions and insightful responses, which contributed to creating a very enjoyable camp experience for all

Ways you can help your child be active.

- Be an active role model and have a positive attitude to being active.
- Encourage active play in the backyard, going for a fast walk, dancing to music, riding a bike or more vigorous activities like running and swimming.
- Make time to be active as a family walk with your children to the local park and kick a ball, play chase or tag games, or walk the dog.
- Plan ahead and schedule a regular time for physical activity with your children.
- Help your kids 'play active' by buying presents that encourage physical activity such as balls, bats, skipping ropes, trampoline or other active equipment.
- Make sure your children have the opportunity to be active after school and on the
 weekends either through active play or organised sport. Talk to your child about
 what activities they would prefer to do. Encourage your child to try a variety of
 activities so that they can find one or more they enjoy and want to continue with.
- Park further away from your destination (such as school, sport or the shops) and walk the rest of the way.
- Keep a football, frisbee, jump rope, scooters or bat and ball in your car at all times.
- Limit the amount of time your children are allowed to spend watching TV, using the internet and playing consoles.
- Plan family holidays or weekends with a view to being active, e.g. somewhere near the beach or where there are good walks to do. Remember to take bikes, tennis rackets, balls and other equipment.


