I watched the choir and I watched the reactions of our students to their performance. How wonderful it would be if we all shared their very positive attitude to never give up and always have hope.










































Kent Road Celebrates Harmony Day

This term students in Year One have been exploring how materials can be changed and combined. Students have learnt about the characteristics and properties of a range of materials through investigations, experiments and STEM tasks.

1S and 1C have had a lot of fun creating different things by bending, stretching, scrunching, ripping, cutting and finding ways to connect pieces without using glue or tape! We did a lot of testing and realised we had to change our designs to use the most suitable materials!


DRIVING QUESTION

How could we design the structure of a house without using tape or glue?

It was a tricky challenge but we used our Growth Mindset to never give up!

Our first area of study in Science and Technology is *Forces*. We are exploring how forces produce and stop movement in objects. We are also learning how to represent our ideas in Science recording experiments with words and diagrams.

2R carefully observed some toys to see what forces act when they are still, move, and stop. In groups, we discussed our ideas and drew on our background knowledge to decide what forces were acting. Many students noted how energy was transformed and used by the toys.

We recorded our ideas using diagram with labels and vectors (arrows with direction and length representing the direction and strength of the forces). A lot of questions were recorded for future experiments too!

We are really looking forward to finding out more about forces like gravity, buoyancy, air resistance and friction.









Year Three are crazy about SiMiLeS!

Year Three have been learning to include more descriptive language into their writing. Inspired by Roald Dahl, Year Three have been experimenting with fun similes. We include similes in our writing to make it more engaging for the reader. A simile is a figure of speech involving the comparison of one thing with another thing of a different kind, using the words like or as. Here are some fun similes 3L included into their writing about stormy weather.

'In the storm you could hear thunder like a whip crack' - By Rafael

'The weather was as cold as Antarctica'- By Shriya

'The clouds were as dark as tar' - By Aloise

'The sun was going behind the clouds like it was playing hide and seek' - By Harper'

The rain came down like a cheetah it was so fast' - By Xavier

'The storm was banging like a monster' - By Isaac

'The lightning smashed the floor like hulk' – By Kyce

What is iPLAY?

iPLAY is a school-based program conducted by Australian Catholic University and the University of Newcastle and is funded by the National Health and Medical Research Council and NSW Department of Education. iPLAY aims to promote children's physical activity through implementing a whole-school approach.

iPLAY involves 6 key components:

Quality physical education and school sport

Classroom movement breaks

Physically active homework

Active playgrounds

Community physical activity links

Parent/caregiver engagement





Over the next four school terms a section will be dedicated to iPLAY in our school newsletter. This section will have information and ideas for promoting physical activity and fundamental movement skill development in children.

This week teachers participated in an iPLAY training session. During the session teachers participated in a practical component. This required team work and good throwing and catching skills. Teachers were asked to create their own aiming game using different objects around the playground. Here is how they went...

National Ride2School Day is held around Australia in March every year. It provides an opportunity for students to try riding, walking, skating or scooting to school as well as celebrating the regular walkers and riders.

Kent Road Public School is encouraging students to ride their bike to school next Friday for National Ride2School Day.

Students who ride or walk to school contribute to their minimum physical activity level of 60 minutes per day. They are also more focused and ready to learn compared to those who are driven to school.

Safe riding tips

- Always wear an approved <u>bicycle helmet</u>, properly fitted and fastened
- Always **obey the road rules**, including traffic lights, stop signs and give way signs
- Allow pedestrians a metre of space on **shared paths**, where possible.
- Ride in a predictable manner so that other road users do not have to react suddenly to your movements
- Give hand signals when changing lanes or turning left or right
- Make yourself visible by wearing bright, light or reflective clothing
- Plan your route using quieter streets, bicycle paths or shared paths
- Always be in control of your bicycle. It is an offence to ride with both hands off the handlebars, feet off the pedals or to carry anything that prevents you from having control.

Children between 10 and 12 should ride away from busy roads.

Children under 12 and adult riders accompanying and supervising them may ride on the footpath, unless there are signs specifically prohibiting cycling.
