

# Old Schoolhouse Museum Excursion

This week year one went back in time and visited the Old Schoolhouse Museum. The first activity we did was visit the classroom from 1910. Here we sang 'God Save the King' standing up next to our desks. We learnt how students sang this anthem every day before they started learning. We then learnt how they used a jelly pad to make copies and used stamps often for letters, numbers and maps.











After that, we took part in a treasure hunt! We had to carefully look around the room to find precious artefacts. Everyone also had a go at old games and toys such as marbles, knucklebones and all sorts of wooden toys and puzzles.





Next, we took part in various drills outside, holding a pair of dumb bells. We practiced different arm stretches. Then we marched over to the playground games. Here we played with quoits, a long skipping rope and played a game of 'fly' with some sticks!

Then, we went outside and learnt about the maypole! Children used to dance and skip whilst holding coloured ribbons around a tall maypole. We even got to dress up with sailor collars for the boys and pinafores for the girls! This was very fun!





Lastly, we went into the 1800s room where we sat on long, heavy benches at wooden desks. Here we used dippens and ink to write! We talked about how that cane was used as punishment and felt so relieved that it isn't used in the present day!





It was such a fun day and we learnt a lot about school in the past!



This term Year 2 have been looking at Push and Pull in Science. Over the term we have looked at the different types of forces and where we see these forces in our everyday lives.





This week 2C and 2H made their own parachutes. Students created their own character out of Lego that would ride the parachute. Their aim was the make a parachute that would protect their character the whole way down.

In groups students designed their parachutes and decided what materials they would need. They then made changes on possible problems that could occur when they let their parachute go from the top of our classroom stairs.

Most groups decided they needed a plastic bag, a cup, string and even some cardboard. Once the parachutes were designed it was time to make them.

When the parachute was finished each group placed their Lego character securely in the parachute.
