Mr Vogels has been seconded to work with the NSW Department of Education in a data analysis role for the next 18 months. We wish him all the best for this new role, and thank him for everything he has done for his class this year.

Miss Sarah Dahdah will teach 1V for the rest of the year. Miss Dahdah has been working with Year One students during the learning at home period, and is familiar with the students. She has been looking forward to meeting them in person and is excited to share the teaching with Mrs Sarti.

KISS AND RIDE ZONE

Parents are reminded that we all have a responsibility to be safe drivers and safe pedestrians. Parking rangers have attended the school in the past week. Illegal U-turns across double lines, speeding, stopping in No Stopping zones are behaviours which place everyone at risk, and will incur a fine and loss of demerit points.

KISS AND RIDE ZONE

Kiss and Ride Zones are designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. They are designed for quick entry and exit, these zones minimise congestion and risk when used properly by all parents and carers.

These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes. You're required to remain in, or within 3 metres of, your vehicle.

<u>Observe No Parking Signs</u>: You have 2 minutes to drop-off or pick up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Failure to observe these rules can get you a \$191 fine and 2 demerit points.

Observe No Stopping Signs: Do not stop for any reason. The first 10m from an intersection is a No Stopping zone. Yellow kerb lines are also no stopping zones. Failing to observe these rules can get you a \$344 fine and 2 demerit points.

<u>Pedestrian Crossings</u>: In a queue of traffic, no part of your vehicle can stop on a pedestrian crossing. It is unsafe to let your child out of a vehicle at a pedestrian crossing as this is a No Stopping zone. Failure to observe these rules can get you a \$457 fine and 2 demerit points.

<u>Driveways and Footpaths</u>: do no park on/ across a driveway or footpath. Failure to observe these rules can get you a \$344 fine and 2 demerit points.

Double Parking: Double parking is illegal and very dangerous in a school zone and will get you a fine of \$344 and 2 demerit points.

<u>U turns</u>: Illegal U turns in a school zone are dangerous and will get you a fine of \$344 and 2 demerit points.

SCHOOL UNIFORM - PLEASE ORDER NOW

The school uniform shop remains closed <u>except</u> for online orders.

A member of the school's administration staff, Mrs Hogan, will pack online orders and notify parents when they are ready to be collected from the front office. Please note, we are waiting for deliveries of white polo shirts in most sizes. New supplies are expected within the next few weeks.

Items that are not the correct size can be returned if the tag is still attached.

I encourage parents who anticipate their child will need new uniform items for Term One 2022 to **place your order as soon as possible**. The suppliers of school uniform are experiencing significant delays with items coming from overseas and the best way of ensuring your child will have the school uniform items they need is to place an order now.

Parents of children starting Kindergarten in 2022 can place an online order for uniform items or a Kindergarten pack.

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION 2022

Parents who have submitted an application for Kindergarten 2022 can now book two orientation visits for their child. The visits will allow children the opportunity to become familiar with the classrooms, playground and teachers and give them an opportunity to meet other children starting school in 2022.

Only children who have been enrolled are permitted to attend.

OC TEST – YEAR FOUR

The new date for the Year Four Opportunity Class test is 17th November. Parents who applied for their child to sit this test will have received notification of this date. The OC test will be an online test which students undertake at school on 17th November.

CANTEEN

At this stage, the canteen will remain closed for the remainder of Term 4 to facilitate safe supervision of students in the playground. Students will need to bring morning tea and lunch each day.

ASSEMBLY

As we are currently under Level 3+ restrictions schools are not permitted to have assemblies. Parents will be advised when we are able to resume assemblies, and we will make a plan for the presentation of gold medals should assemblies not be permitted this year.

SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHS

Under level 3+ restrictions non-essential activities are not permitted. School photos are classified as non-essential. The school is investigating other options for class photos and will advise parents when we have more information.

NO SHARING OF FOOD (birthday treats)

Unfortunately, birthday cakes, cupcakes, unwrapped lollies etc are not permitted to be shared at school at this time.

PLAYGROUND UPGRADES

Our Kindergarten students were excited to discover their new playground installations which was created during Term Three.

BEFORE SCHOOL DROP OFF ARRANGEMENTS – SO FAR SO GOOD!

Students must not arrive at school before 8.35am unless attending OOSH.

All gates will be open for students to enter the school but will be locked from 9.06am. Students arriving after the 9.05am bell will need to enter via the administration office gate on Kent Road. **Parents are not permitted to enter school grounds unless attending OOSH.**

AFTER SCHOOL ARRANGEMENTS – PLEASE SEE CHANGES FOR KENT ROAD PICK-UP

At the end of the school day students will be dismissed between **3.00pm-3.10 pm**. Yesterday with all students back at school, gates 1, 4 and 5 worked well. Due to the crowds at gates 2 and 3, we will trial Year Two waiting outside the gate near the old kiss and ride zone. Parents are asked to wait on the grass near the road side and allow space for students to exit the gates.

Older brothers and sisters will be sent to their youngest sibling's class, and wait (at a distance from the group to minimise interaction) to be collected.

Years Two-Six	Students in Years 2-6 will leave via the gate which has been nominated by parents. All parents of children in Years 2-6 must establish with their child/children which gate they will collect them from, and not change it as this causes confusion.
	Students exiting from gates 2 and 3 will wait to be collected outside the gate in designated areas.

** **Students should be collected by 3.10pm**. Parents who have difficulty collecting their child at 3.10pm are asked to book their child into OOSH. Teachers are required to attend meetings directly after school finishes and are not available to supervise students after 3.10pm.

*** Teachers are not available to meet with parents in person at this time. Should parents need to speak with your child's teacher please email the school to request a phone interview.
