STUDENT VACCINATIONS

There is currently no approved vaccine in Australia for children under 12 years of age.

As with the regular School Vaccination Program (for diseases such as Rubella), parental consent is required for each student receiving a covid vaccination, currently this is only available to students 12 years and over. Vaccination for students is not mandatory. Please note that this program is **not** occurring with primary schools.

STUDENT LEADERS 2022

Next week we will begin the process of electing student leaders for 2022. Year Five students will be invited to nominate their peers, or themselves; Year Five students will then vote to determine the ten girls and ten boys who will move to the next stage of the process. Following this, the twenty contenders will prepare a speech at school which they will present to students in Years 4-6, who will then vote for the Student Leadership team for 2022.

Parents are not permitted to attend but we hope to film each individual student's speech and make it available to the student's parents.

KISS AND RIDE ZONE

Kiss and Ride Zones are designed for your convenience and for your child's safety. These zones operate under the same conditions as no parking zones, which means you may stop to drop off or pick up children for a maximum of 2 minutes. You're required to remain in, or within 3 metres of, your vehicle.

SCHOOL UNIFORM - PLEASE ORDER NOW

The school uniform shop remains closed except for online orders.

A member of the school's administration staff, Mrs Hogan, will pack online orders and notify parents when they are ready to be collected from the front office. Please note, we are waiting for deliveries of white polo shirts in most sizes. New supplies are expected within the next few weeks.

Items that are not the correct size can be returned if the tag is still attached.

I encourage parents who anticipate their child will need new uniform items for Term One 2022 to **place your order as soon as possible**. The suppliers of school uniform are experiencing significant delays with items coming from overseas and the best way of ensuring your child will have the school uniform items they need is to place an order now.

Parents of children starting Kindergarten in 2022 can place an online order for uniform items or a Kindergarten pack.

KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION 2022

Parents who have submitted an application for Kindergarten 2022 can now book two orientation visits for their child. The visits will allow children the opportunity to become familiar with the classrooms, playground and teachers and give them an opportunity to meet other children starting school in 2022.

Only children who have been enrolled are permitted to attend.

OC TEST – YEAR FOUR

The new date for the Year Four Opportunity Class test is 17th November. Parents who applied for their child to sit this test will have received notification of this date. The OC test will be an online test which students undertake at school on 17th November.

CANTEEN

At this stage, the canteen will remain closed for the remainder of Term 4 to facilitate safe supervision of students in the playground. Students will need to bring morning tea and lunch each day.

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

Are you thinking about joining the band in 2022?

We are seeking interest from students in Years 2-5.

Q. Where/when do I have my weekly instrumental lessons?

Lessons occur before or after school in classrooms.

Q. Do I need prior musical experience?

Anyone can join the band, whether you already play an instrument or not.

Q. How much does it cost?

Weekly group lessons cost \$20 per student for 30 mins. Weekly individual lessons usually cost around \$30-35 per student for 30 mins. If you join the band in Term 2 2022, further band fees will apply.

Q. What instruments can I choose from?

Flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, euphonium, keyboards, bass guitar and percussion (drum kit and other percussion instruments).

Q. Where can I hire an instrument?

You will be able to hire an instrument from the school. If you wish to buy an instrument, we recommend *In Tune Music* shop, *Turramurra Music* shop or *Mall Music Macquarie.*

Q. What do I need to commit to?

Band students need to be committed to weekly lessons, home practice, taking care of their instrument and being punctual to band rehearsals.

Q. Why join the band?

Playing in a band can contribute to a student's development of team spirit, self-esteem, social interaction, self-discipline, and responsibility. Plus, it's a lot of fun!
