DEMOUNTABLE CLASSROOM REMOVAL

Parents are advised the removal of the demountable classrooms adjacent to Herring Road is now scheduled to begin tomorrow, Wednesday 31st March and will continue over the next few weeks. Once the demountables are removed, work will take place to restore the grass. After the grass has established students will be able to play in this area.

During the demountable removal, there may be times when gate four is closed and all Herring Road access is via gate five. Traffic controllers will be in place to manage access.

PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT

Work will commence in the holidays to install new playground equipment in the area behind D block. This playground development is being funded by the school and our P&C Association, and includes climbing walls, ropes, slides and balancing beams. The construction will take 3-4 weeks.



We have also ordered two multipurpose sport goals, and two tossball towers to add to our playground equipment which have been funded from a grant by the Local Schools Community Fund.

STUDENTS WHO ARE UNWELL

Anyone with symptoms of COVID-19 (fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, loss of taste, and loss of smell), even mild s toms, should not be at school.

Occasionally, as before, students may have to wait for one or two minutes to use the bathrooms at the end of recess or lunch. To overcome this we encourage students to use the bathrooms throughout break times and not wait until the end of the break.

FOOD ALLERGIES

We have a number of students who have food allergies, particularly to nuts. I ask all parents to be mindful of these students if they send birthday treats to their child's class for students to share. Any treats which contain nuts will be returned.

We must all work together to keep all students safe.

COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

A reminder to all school parents that regular school attendance is essential for your child to achieve their educational best. Regular school attendance also helps your child to build and maintain friendships with other children.

The importance of arriving on time

Arriving at school and class on time:

- ensures that students do not miss out on important learning activities scheduled early in the day
- helps students learn the importance of punctuality and routine
- gives students time to greet their friends before class
- reduces classroom disruption

What if my child has to be away from school?

On occasion, your child may need to be absent from school. Justified reasons for student absences may include:

- · being sick, or having an infectious disease
- having an unavoidable medical appointment
- · being required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- exceptional or urgent family circumstance (e.g. attending a funeral)

Following an absence from school you must ensure that within 7 days you provide your child's school with a verbal or written explanation for the absence. However, if the school has not received an explanation from you within 2 days, the school may contact you to discuss the absence.

Travel

Families are encouraged to travel during school holidays. If travel during school term is necessary, discuss this with your child's school principal. An *Application for Extended Leave* may need to be completed. Absences relating to travel will be marked as leave on the roll and therefore contribute to your child's total absences for the year.
