
Dear Kent Road Parents and Carers,

Last week I had the privilege of attending the launch of the NSW City Country Alliance Immersion and Education Centre in Gol Gol in outback New South Wales, with Miss McKenna and Ms Hamiltion.

The City Country Alliance (CCA) was formed to develop links between city and country students and schools. Over the past four years, Kent Road has developed a sister school relationship with Pomona Public School which is on the border between New South Wales and Victoria and also very close to the South Australian border.

Pomona Public School has 22 students in total. It was lovely to catch up with the Pomona students who visited Sydney and our school in 2018, and share our recollections of their visit. We hope to be able to further develop our contact with rural and remote schools through the CCA.

MOBILE DEVICES AT SCHOOL

The NSW Department of Education implemented a statewide policy in 2020 regarding the use of personal mobile devices at school, including mobile phones and smart watches. The school's executive team is currently creating a school procedure in response to the department's policy.

Parents should be aware the government's policy includes the following:

Schools must restrict the use of digital devices by primary school students during class, at
recess and at lunch <u>unless</u>: use is approved by a teacher or principal for an educational purpose; an
exemption applies; or use of digital devices and online services is required for medical reasons or for
reasonable adjustments made as part of a student's individual education plan.

• Students must:

- Be safe, responsible and respectful users of digital devices and online services, and support their peers to be the same.
- Respect and follow school rules and procedures and the decisions made by staff, knowing that other schools may have different arrangements.
- Communicate respectfully and collaboratively with peers, school staff and the school community and behave in the ways described in the Behaviour Code for Students.

• Parents and carers must:

- Recognise the role they play in educating their children and modelling the behaviours that underpin the safe, responsible and respectful use of digital devices and online services.
- Support implementation of the school procedure, including its approach to resolving issues.
- Take responsibility for their child's use of digital devices and online services at home such as use of online services with age and content restrictions.
- Communicate with school staff and the school community respectfully and collaboratively as outlined in the <u>2018 School Community Charter</u>.
- Switch off or put their digital devices on silent when at official school functions, during meetings and when assisting in the classroom.

Should a student need to make a call during the school day, they must approach the administration office and ask for permission to use the school's phone.

During school hours, parents and carers are expected to only contact their children via the school office.

Once the school's procedures have been completed a copy will be provided to all parents.

NAPLAN – YEAR THREE and YEAR FIVE

Starting next Tuesday 11th May, students in Years Three and Five will undertake NAPLAN testing over two weeks.

Year Five students will complete all NAPLAN tests online. Year Three students will complete all tests online except for writing which will be a paper/pencil test.

Students have undertaken practice tests to become familiar with test procedures and the online format. No other preparation is necessary.

The test dates are scheduled over two weeks so that disruption can be minimised. I ask parents of all students participating in NAPLAN to ensure their children arrive at school before the bell so as to not disupt the other students in the class.
