All students are being encouraged by their teachers to take greater responsibility for their possessions including hats, jackets, lunchboxes and drink bottles, and teachers will be implementing a new approach to returning lost items to their owners.

Fundamental to this being successful is having students' names written on their possessions. I ask all parents to check their child's clothing and equipment to ensure the name is clearly written on it.

The new procedures for Lost Property will be outlined in next week's newsletter.

#### NAPLAN

Students in Years 3 and 5 will continue with NAPLAN testing this week as per the schedule. I thank parents for ensuring their child is at school on time so as to not disturb others by arriving late. The last testing day will be Friday 21<sup>st</sup> May.

#### ATTENDANCE

The NSW Department of Education's Attendance policy requires students to attend school each day it is open, unless students are unwell, or on approved leave. Last week each school principal received a list of students in their schools whose attendance is causing concern. Students with an attendance rate of less than 80% are classified as at risk.

Each year the Department of Education's Home School Liaison Officer attends each school to monitor students whose attendance, and provide support for students is attendance is causing concern.

Research indicates consistent high attendance is an indicator of a student's academic progress. We all want students to have the best opportunity to succeed at school and regular attendance will give them this opportunity.

Well done students for taking responsibility for placing their rubbish in the bins and keeping the playground eating areas clean last week.

#### **BE A FRIEND**

As part of our Personal Development studies this term, each grade is focusing on friendship - what it means to be a friend, how to make friends, and how to resolve problems with your friends. Parents may like to discuss the following ideas at home with their child.

### What makes a good friend?

Having good friends makes you happy, and being a good friend to others makes them happy, too. Think about your friendships - are you being a good friend? Are your friends being a good friend to you?

Good friends make you feel good

Good friends say and do things that make you feel good, giving compliments and congratulations and being happy for you.

Good friends support each other

If you're feeling down, a good friend will support you. If you need help, a good friend will try to help you out.

Good friends don't always have everything in common

Everyone is different, and has different hobbies and interests. Even if you're not into the exact same things, a good friend will encourage you rather than making you feel bad for liking a different band, activity, TV show or animal! A good friend understands that sometimes you do your own thing, and enjoys doing the things you have in common together.

Good friends listen

A good friend allows you to talk and doesn't interrupt you. They're interested in what you have to say.

Good friends are trustworthy

If you tell a good friend something private, they won't share it. You can trust a good friend not to be judgmental.

Good friends handle conflict respectfully and respect boundaries

Sometimes you and your friend might disagree on something. Sometimes you might have said or done something that upset your friend. A good friend will tell you if you've done something to hurt them. If you tell a good friend they've hurt you, they'll be sorry and won't do it again.

Good friendships go both ways

It's not a good friendship if one of you is doing all the talking and the other is doing all the listening, all the time. Good friends make each other feel good, rather than one friend receiving all the compliments and the other giving them all the time. In a good friendship, you're making each other feel great!

#### MOBILE DEVICES AT SCHOOL

I ask all parents to take a few minutes to read through the NSW Department of Education's policy regarding the use of personal mobile devices at school, including mobile phones and smart watches. The school's executive team is currently creating a school procedure in response to the department's policy.

Parents should be aware the government's policy includes the following:

**Schools must restrict the use of digital devices by primary school students** during class, at recess and at lunch <u>unless</u>: use is approved by a teacher or principal for an educational purpose; an exemption applies; or use of digital devices and online services is required for medical reasons or for reasonable adjustments made as part of a student's individual education plan.

#### Students must:

- Be safe, responsible and respectful users of digital devices and online services, and support their peers to be the same.
- Respect and follow school rules and procedures and the decisions made by staff, knowing that other schools may have different arrangements.
- Communicate respectfully and collaboratively with peers, school staff and the school community and behave in the ways described in the Behaviour Code for Students.

Parents and carers must:

Recognise the role they play in educating their children and modelling the behaviours that underpin the safe, responsible and respectful use of digital devices and online services.

Support implementation of the school procedure, including its approach to resolving issues.

- Take responsibility for their child's use of digital devices and online services at home such as use of online services with age and content restrictions.
- Communicate with school staff and the school community respectfully and collaboratively as outlined in the <u>2018 School Community Charter</u>.
- Switch off or put their digital devices on silent when at official school functions, during meetings and when assisting in the classroom.

Should a student need to make a call during the school day, they must approach the administration office and ask for permission to use the school's phone.

During school hours, parents and carers are expected to only contact their children via the school office.

Once the school's procedures have been completed a copy will be provided to all parents.



different types of rubbish. Students noticed that all the water picked up the rubbish and it went into our rivers and oceans.












Kindergarten are learning all about animals and how to take care of living things. We are so excited to take care of the ducks for the next two weeks and watch them grow!



# Year 6 Debating

Last week, we had the first round of the NSW Premier's Debating Competition with the Kent Road Koalas versus the Kent Road Kangaroos. We were really glad to



have the chance to debate face-to-face and have an adjudicator on site and have our first contest in a familiar space.

In the Ryde-Kuringai Debating Competition this week via Zoos, the Kent Road Kookaburras and Kingfishers debated the topic "That primary students must participate in 30 minutes of physical activity every day". Both teams were affirmative.

The Kookaburras debated Eastwood Heights Public School, who were the negative. We both had amazing arguments but unfortunately, we lost. The Kingfishers took on Lindfield Public School. It was a close debate on how much daily exercise students need and whether that should happen at school. We were excited to win this round!

We are looking forward to our next debates in Week 6.

# How many apples?

It started with simple questions:

How many apples are in this pile? How many apples would there be if there were eight layers?



Using diagrams and tables, and our knowledge of triangular numbers, this was easy enough to work out.

We were then asked a much harder question:

What's the rule to work out how many apples in any number of layers?

To solve this problem, we needed to use many different aspects of mathematics: geometry, ratios, tables and patterning, algebra and algorithmic thinking. We used many different strategies and an array of different resources to make models and test our ideas. Our new classrooms, with flexible spaces and great acoustics meant we could discuss our ideas and make spaces for our models.





In the end, we didn't find a simple answer. We did, however, work out how to approximate the volume of a triangular pyramid, how to describe and test our ideas, and how to describe our ideas in mathematical language to our peers.
