CONCERNS RAISED BY MOTORISTS

We have received a number of phone calls over the past weeks from local residents and motorists who have raised concerns about students and parents stepping onto the road without looking, walking across the road in front of moving cars, darting in between cars and not using the available pedestrian crossings.

As adults, we know children will copy the behaviour of the adults around them. As adults we have a more highly developed sense of distance however this does not develop in children until they are teenagers. If we adults model crossing the road at the safest place, it is highly likely children will copy this behaviour.

I ask all parents to cross at the available pedestrian crossings; to say stop, look and listen or look right/left/right (and repeatedly say it out loud to your children) until it becomes a habit. I am becoming increasingly concerned there will be a serious accident involving our students that could be avoided if we, as adults, model the correct behaviour.

ASSEMBLY HALL ROOF WORK

The hall roof replacement is almost finished and work will then begin on replacing the roof on the K-2 toilet block (near OOSH). Students will need to use the S block toilets near the tennis court whilst this work takes place.

Once the fencing is removed from around the assembly hall we will return to our usual pick-up arrangements at the end of the school day; band will return to the assembly hall and gate 2 will re-open.


CONGRATULATIONS JOANNA


Congratulation Joanna – your hard work is bringing amazing results!

We also did find some hard aspects to debating as communicating was a big issue and we would have to find time to talk and plan during break times at school. We learned how to write rebuttals which require a lot of practice. It was a struggle to rebut the other teams' arguments as we would be put on the spot and were required to make up a whole paragraph about why their arguments were wrong.

We learned how to write persuasive speeches and even many different and intriguing words to support our arguments and convince our audience.

Great work so far Year 5 team, and good luck in the semi finals!


