# **CHANGES TO ISOLATION REQUIREMENTS**

The NSW government announced changes to the Public Health Orders this week.

- People who test positive to COVID-19 and complete their 7-day self-isolation period do not have to test or self-isolate for 12 weeks after their release.
- Self-isolation means staying at home or at your accommodation.

This means you cannot drive your children to school or day care; you must ask someone else to do this.

You must only leave self-isolation to get medical care or in an emergency.




# What's New in Year Two

We have also been introduced to our buddies and enjoyed working together to create Harmony Day artworks.







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
