Dear Kent Road Parents and Carers,

I am happy to report students are settling in well to their new class routines, and our programs are wellunderway.

KINDERGARTEN BEST START

Over the past week our Kindergarten students have been participating in the Kindergarten Best Start Assessment program with classroom teachers. It is expected that all students will have completed the Literacy and Numeracy assessment by the end of next week, and soon after parents will receive a report with suggestions as to the next areas of learning focus.

MEDICAL NEEDS

Please ensure the school is aware of any medical needs your child may have. It is the responsibility of parents/ carers to provide updated Health Care Plans/Action Plans and medications to the school. Students are not permitted to carry medication in their own bags.

Students who have been diagnosed with asthma, an allergy and/or anaphylaxis must have a current Action Plan and appropriate medication. Occasionally students require medication to be administered at school. This can only be done with the appropriate written notification.

Should medication be required it will be stored in the front office and administered under supervision.

Thank you to parents/carers who have already provided the office with an updated Health Care Plan, Action Plan and medication this year. Action Plans are medical documents completed and signed by the treating doctor, not a parent. Please be advised that Action Plans do not expire, and therefore the plan remains valid.

PEDESTRIAN SAFETY

May I please ask that you ensure you drop off and collect your child safely and park appropriately. Please do not park across neighbour's driveways as it creates inconvenience for the neighbour and ill-will towards the school.

If you are walking, please use the footpaths rather than walking on or across the road dangerously. It is everyone's responsibility to ensure our students are safe.

TECHNOLOGY USAGE

It has come to my attention that a number of students are wearing smart watches and there have been a few incidents where students are using these inappropriately during the school day. All parents should be aware staff will contact parents directly if there is a medical or other concern. It is not the student's responsibility to contact their parents if they feel unwell or upset.

Students must not use their mobile phones or smart watches to contact parents throughout the day, and parents should not be contacting students during learning time. Students are not permitted to take photos of other students or teachers, record teachers or students in the classroom or playground without their permission.

Students seen using these devices inappropriately will have their watches or phones removed and stored at the front office for parents to collect.

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COMPASS ACCESS

Unfortunately we continue to experience difficulties aligning the Department of Education's enrolment system and COMPASS. We are working closely with both the Department and COMPASS to resolve these issues. For parents still unable to access COMPASS, and who are reading the newsletter via our school website, please be assured we are working hard to have these issues resolved.

We know that being together in the classroom is the best thing for our students' learning, growth and welfare. This term we will continue to implement measures to allow us to prioritise both the wellbeing of our students and a consistent and productive learning environment.

If your child is unwell, you must keep them at home. If they are displaying COVID-19 symptoms, they should take a COVID-19 test (PCR or RAT) and follow the advice from the NSW Government on managing COVID-19 safely at home.

Your child should only return to school when they are symptom free.

Year 2 are off to a great start! We have been getting so creative. We have been creating designs to reflect our identity and even making classroom animal masterpieces.


















In Year 3, there is a strong focus on kindness! In each class, students record all the acts of kindness they see both inside and outside of the classroom.
