# K-2 Assembly












In Maths, we have been very busy creating different repeated patterns and using our knowledge of shapes to create symmetrical mandalas.














Can you name our repeated patterns?

In science lessons Year 4 have been studying the topic *Surface Changes*. In small groups, they conducted online research and produced beautiful posters all about WEATHERING!

















Year 6 have been working hard on elevating their narrative writing using descriptive language, whilst varying sentence structure and length to keep it interesting.

# **PEDESTRIAN SAFETY**


I ask all parents to drive and park safely and in accordance with NSW road rules, and to model safe pedestrian behaviour as they drop off and collect their child to school.






#### STUDENTS WHO ARE UNWELL
