Principal's Report

SCHOOL FEES INVOICE

PARENTS and CITIZENS (P&C) ASSOCIATION

Last night, the Kent Road P&C held its first meeting for 2018 following the Annual General Meeting at which all executive positions were declared vacant and the 2018 office bearers were elected.

Many thanks to all outgoing members of the P&C executive, and congratulations to all new office bearers.

Through the hard work of our P&C and the parent community, funds raised last year will be used to purchase additional seating for Kindergarten and Year Two (\$8,500), an additional set of 30 i-Pads (\$13,170.00), an additional class set of laptops (\$18,000), five new projectors for classrooms (\$15,000) and an interactive panel for 6G (\$8,500).

I thank the P&C whose hard work has provided the funds for these resources which will enhance the quality of the learning experience for our students.

FOOTSTEPS DANCE PROGRAM

All classes participated in the first Footsteps Dance lesson last week. I heard many positive comments from students including 'that was the best fun ever'.

The cost of the program is \$30 for the term, which has been included in the school invoice which was issued today. Should you not want your child to participate in the dance program please advise the school in writing and an alternate activity will be provided for your child.


Kindergarten – Year Two Assembly

Each week at assemblies, Class Merit Awards are presented to students who have demonstrated progress, effort and positive behaviour.

In addition to the Class Merit Certificates, the school has an award system in which students collect green cards for demonstrating the school values of respect, responsibility and engaged learning; students progress through the levels (as indicated below) collecting awards until they reach the gold medal level.

Walking together to and from school

Walking to and from school with your child helps ease traffic congestion, reduces your carbon footprint, promotes physical activity and provides a talking point about road safety. The Roads and Maritime Services website has more information on active transport.

When you walk with your child, talk about safe behaviour. Always demonstrate correct pedestrian behaviour. The best way you can help your child to be a safe pedestrian is to:

- give them lots of supervised practice with you or another trusted adult.
- talk with and teach your child about being alert in a road environment.
- always hold your child's hand.
- explain why the place you have chosen is the safest place to cross the road.
- point out dangers, such as vehicles coming out of driveways.
- use pedestrian crossings and traffic lights correctly.
- teach your child to keep turning their head in both directions to look and listen for traffic as they cross the road.
- talk with them about everything they need to think about to keep safe when walking.
- explain why they should look and listen before crossing a driveway, road or car park.
- talk with your child and reinforce Stop! Look! Listen! Think! every time you cross the road together
- o **STOP!** one step back from the kerb.
- o LOOK! continuously look both ways.
- o **LISTEN!** for the sounds of approaching traffic.

THINK! whether it is safe to cross.

Walking together also helps you to observe if older children are ready to cross the road independently. At school, your child will learn about road safety as part of Personal Development, Health and Physical Education. Help them learn the pedestrian safety messages by using them and sharing them whenever you are out and about.




Parking and traffic rules in school zones

You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. **Please choose safety over convenience.**




