Principal's Report

SCHOOL BUILDING UPGRADE

The planning process for the upgrade of Kent Road Public School's classrooms and facilities is developing well with many productive meetings with the architect and project manager being held over the past weeks.

There are two further Information Booths which will be held at the school on 5th April and 3rd May from 2-4pm.

Next term, there will be a presentation evening to parents to outline the project though no date has been set for this event at this stage.

HARMONY DAY EVENTS AT KENT ROAD

Harmony Day occurs on 21st March each year and coincides with the United Nations' International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination.

Harmony Day celebrates Australia's cultural diversity. In schools we celebrate inclusiveness, respect and a sense of belonging for all Australians, from the traditional owners of the land to those who have come from many countries around the world.

The ongoing theme of Harmony Day is 'everyone belongs'. Harmony Day is a day of cultural respect for all. By participating in Harmony Day activities, we can learn and understand how all Australians equally belong to this nation and enrich it.

Today Kent Road students attended a wonderful performance by Wa-sa-bi, a Japanese performance group who showcased a mix of contemporary and traditional music. The students were thoroughly entertained and intrigued by the performance today, and I thank Ms Hamilton for organizing this event.

Tomorrow students will undertake their Footsteps Dance lessons as usual, and the dances will have a multicultural theme.

All students are invited to wear orange clothes tomorrow, as orange is the colour of Harmony Day, or the colours of their country. Students will need to wear sports shoes for dancing.

The funds raised will be used to purchase school equipment.


Look see, look at Kindergarten!

Year 1 students have been learning about sculptural and relief art. We learnt about the artist Alexander Calder and his interesting sculptures. These sculptures are made of different materials. Some sculptures are brightly coloured, and some are not. Many of them are abstract. Inspired by Calder's work, we created our own abstract relief artworks focusing on warm and cool colours.













2W had a visit from a Huntsman spider. We named him Harry and enjoyed observing his behaviour. We decided to research Huntsman spiders. Here is some of the information we found out:

The Huntsman is a harmless spider found all over Australia. It has eight eyes. The Huntsman does not make a web, but usually lives under rocks, bark, in tree stumps or it will come inside to hide. They can run up to a metre per second. The Huntsman lays up to 200 eggs that are oval and silky. The mother helps its baby get out of the egg.

John Coburn was an Australian abstract painter, teacher, tapestry designer and printmaker. The stylised shapes in his work refer to the plant and leaf forms found in a tropical forest. In other famous tapestries he includes the theme of rock formations in the ancient land of Australia and the connection Aboriginal people have with this land.

One of his designs is currently displayed in the Sydney Opera House – The Curtain of the Sun.

RIDE SAFELY TO SCHOOL DAY- FRIDAY 23RD OF MARCH

National Ride2School Day is held around Australia in March every year. It provides an opportunity for students to try riding, walking, skating or scooting to school as well as celebrating the regular walkers and riders.

Kent Road Public School is encouraging students to ride their bike to school next Friday for National Ride2School Day.

Students who ride or walk to school contribute to their minimum physical activity level of 60 minutes per day. They are also more focused and ready to learn compared to those who are driven to school.

So put your helmet on and jump on your bike, to get involved with **Ride2School Day on Friday 23rd of March!**



Safe riding tips

Always wear an approved bicycle helmet, properly fitted and fastened

Always **obey the road rules**, including traffic lights, stop signs and give way signs

Allow pedestrians a metre of space on **shared paths**, where possible.

Ride in a predictable manner so that other road users do not have to react suddenly to your movements

Give hand signals when changing lanes or turning left or right

Make yourself visible by wearing bright, light or reflective clothing

Plan your route using quieter streets, bicycle paths or shared paths

Always be in control of your bicycle. It is an offence to ride with both hands off the handlebars, feet off the pedals or to carry anything that prevents you from having control.


Children between 10 and 12 should ride away from busy roads.

Children under 12 and adult riders accompanying and supervising them may ride on the footpath, unless there are signs specifically prohibiting cycling.

Kent Road Speech Pathology Project

In 2017 Kent Road Public School began a project with Macquarie University to have Masters of Speech Pathology Students working with teachers and students at Kent Road Public School. The Masters of Speech Pathology students are supervised by a Certified Practicing Speech Pathologist, Tory Giles. This is an exciting project as not many schools have access to Speech Pathology services in their school.

Speech pathologists study, diagnose and treat communication disorders, including difficulties with speaking, listening, understanding language, reading, writing, social skills, stuttering and using voice. They work with people who have difficulty communicating because of developmental delays, stroke, brain injuries, learning disability, intellectual disability, physical disability, dementia and hearing loss, as well as other problems that can affect speech and language. People who experience difficulties swallowing food and drink safely can also be helped by a speech pathologist (Speech Pathology Australia www.speechpathologyaustralia.org.au)



The project is continuing in terms 1 and 2 this year and the Speech Pathologists are working with a number of students and classes within the school. Kent Road Public School is one of the schools leading the way in striving for excellence in learning for students.

NAPLAN 2018

Students in year 3 and 5 will participate in the annual NAPLAN test in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy in May 2018.

To get an idea of what the tests look like, see example questions at www.nap.edu.au

Students at Kent Road Public School will sit the NAPLAN paper test in 2018. Some other schools across Australia may sit the test online this year however, all tests will be reported on using the same NAPLAN assessment scale. The test will move online over the next 2-3 years.




