EASTER LONG WEEKEND

I wish everyone a relaxing, safe Easter long weekend and look forward to seeing everyone return next Tuesday 3rd April.

KINDERGARTEN and YEAR ONE PLAYGROUND

Parents of Kindergarten and Year One children will know there are many parents in the playground between 8.35-9.05. Whilst this is a good opportunity for parents to meet and talk, it does create some difficulties for teachers responsible for supervising the students.

To ensure the safety of our students, I ask parents, grandparents and carers who drop off their children at school in the mornings to sit on the aluminum seats in either the Year One or Kindergarten areas, and to closely supervise their toddlers and preschoolers. This is necessary to enable the teacher on duty to better monitor the playground.

When the music starts at 9.03am parents are asked to say goodbye to their Kindergarten or Year One child and allow the children to line up independently. Please do not walk with the children in their class lines as it prevents the teacher from being able to see all of the students in the class.

After you have said goodbye at 9.03 please move away from the class lines, please do not follow the students, call them back for a final kiss, or follow the children into the bag room.

Teachers want to provide every child the chance to develop independence and the school day starts when the music begins to play.

A teacher is on duty from 8.35am each day and parents can be confident that their child is well supervised, especially if the procedures above are respected.

HAT PARADE

This Thursday 29th March, students in Kindergarten, Year One and Year Two are invited to wear which they have designed for our annual parade. The parade will occur in the main quadrangle after which students will move into the hall for some singing, which will be followed by the Easter Egg raffle draw.

STUDENT BANKING - TOMORROW

For students in Years 2-6, bank books will be collected from the morning assembly.

Kindergarten and Year One bank books will be collected as they enter the classroom.

If your child is late arriving to school on Wednesdays their bank book will not be collected for banking.

Students completed art activities in their classes that related to inclusiveness and belonging.




Our next activity was performing some exercises and drills using dumb bells. They were wooden and we had to keep our arms very straight and listen carefully to the instructions.






Finally, we got on the bus and travelled back to school to have lunch.



























Can you guess all the flags we made?

On Monday, Year 5 students attended a school incursion with the Macquarie Island and Antarctica adventurer Chris Olsen.

With our Year 5 students, Chris shared first-hand accounts of his trips to Macquarie Island through his personal photographs, video footages, diary entries and personal reflections. Through these primary sources and personal artefacts, Chris gave students detailed facts about Macquarie Island, talked in depth about the history of the wildlife that lives on and around the island, described the harsh weather conditions and explained the geological significance of this oceanic crust island.

Students were fortunate to handle rock specimens from "Macca", wood from Mawson's Hut and even touched ice from Antarctica! Some student volunteers enjoyed trying on the heavy clothing that was needed to survive on this island for a few days against the chilly temperatures and strong winds.

Year 5 ended their experience with a question and answer opportunity, allowing our students to have any questions they had formed throughout this term's "One Small Island" literature unit answered by an authentic Macquarie Island adventurer.

Information for parents

अनिवार्य रूप से स्कूल जाना

माता-पिता के लिए जानकारी

आपके बच्चे के लिए शिक्षा में अच्छे से अच्छा करने व अपनी जिविका व जीवन के विकल्पों में वृद्धि के लिए, उनकी शिक्षा बहुत महत्वपूर्ण है व स्कूल में नियमित रूप से उपस्थिति ज़रूरी है। NSW में सरकारी स्कूल, माता-पिता के साथ साझेदारी में काम करते हैं, जिससे बच्चों व युवकों में स्कूल में नियमित रूप से उपस्थिति को बढ़ावा दिया जा सके। जब आपका बच्चा हर रोज़ स्कूल आता है तो उसके लिए पढ़ाई आसान हो जाती है व आपका बच्चा अन्य बच्चों के साथ मित्रता करेगा व उसे बनाए रखेगा।

मेरी क़ानुनी ज़िम्मेदारियाँ क्या हैं?

न्यू साऊथ वेल्ज़ में छः वर्ष की आयु से लेकर स्कूल छोड़ने की न्यूनतम आयु के बीच में बच्चों के लिए शिक्षा अनिवार्य है। शिक्षा अधिनियम 1990 (Education Act 1990) के अनुसार माता-पिता के लिए यह सुनिश्चित करना आवश्यक है कि उनके वे बच्चे जो अनिवार्य रूप से स्कूल जाने की उम्र के हैं उनका स्कूल में नामांकन हो, वे नियमित रूप से स्कूल जाएँ, या शिक्षा परिषद, पढ़ाई व शैक्षिक मानक (Board of Studies, Teaching and Educational Standards) में उन्हें घर पर स्कूली शिक्षा पाने के लिए रजिस्टर कराया गया है।

एक बार नामांकन होने के बाद, जब-जब स्कूल विद्यार्थियों के लिए खुलता है तो बच्चों का वहाँ जाना आवश्यक है।

समय पर स्कूल पहुँचने का महत्व

स्कूल व कक्षा में समय पर पहुँचने से

- यह सुनिश्चित होता है कि विद्यार्थी पढाई पढ़ाई की उन आवश्यक गतिविधियों से वंचित नहीं हो रहे हैं जो दिन में सुबह जल्दी की जाती हैं
- विद्यार्थियों को समय-पालन व दिन-चर्या का महत्व जानने में मदद करता है
- विद्यार्थियों को कक्षा से पहले अपने मित्रों से मिलने का समय मिलता है
- कक्षा में बाधा को कम करता है।

देर से आने को आंशिक अनुपस्थिति माना जाता है और माता-पिता को इसका कारण स्पष्ट करना चाहिए।

यदि मेरे बच्चे को स्कूल से छुट्टी लेनी हो तो क्या होगा?

कभी-कभी हो सकता है कि आपके बच्चे को स्कूल से छुट्टी लेनी पड़ेगी। स्कूल से छुट्टी लेनी के उचित कारणों में निम्नलिखित हो सकते हैं

- बीमार होना, या उसे कोई छूत की बीमारी होना
- डॉक्टर से मिलने का समय तय किया होना
- किसी मान्य धार्मिक उत्सव में जाना ज़रूरी हो
- किसी विशेष या महत्वपूर्ण पारिवारिक स्थिति का होना, जैसे कि अंतयेष्टि में जाना।

स्कूल से छुट्टी लेने के बाद आपको सुनिश्चित करना चाहिए कि 7 दिन के अंदर आप बच्चे के स्कूल को मौखिक रूप से या लिख कर अनुपस्थिति का कारण बताएँ। पर यदि 2 दिन के अंदर आप स्कूल को कोई कारण नहीं बताते. हैं तो हो सकता है कि स्कूल अनुपस्थिति के बारे में बात करने के लिए आपसे संपर्क करें।

प्रधानाध्यापक आपके द्वारा दिए गए कारण को स्वीकार करने से मना कर सकता है यदि उसका मानना है कि इस प्रकार की अनुपस्थिति आपके बच्चे के हित के लिए ठीक नहीं है। ऐसी स्थिति में आपके बच्चे की अनुपस्थिति को अनुचित रिकॉर्ड किया जाएगा। जब ऐसा होगा तो प्रधानाध्यापक आपसे इस निर्णय के बारे में बात करेगा/करेगी व यह कि इसके क्या कारण हैं।

अक्सर बार-बार या लम्बे समय के लिए छुट्टी लेने का कारण जब बीमारी का कारण बताया जाता है तो प्रधानाध्यापक मेडिकल सर्टिफिकेट या अन्य काग़ज़ातों के लिए निवेदन कर सकता/ सकती है। प्रधानाध्यापक माता-पिता से डॉक्टरी विशेषज्ञ से बात करने की अनुमति माँग सकता है जिससे बच्चे की स्वास्थ्य देखभाल योजना बनाने के लिए मिल कर काम किया जा सके। यदि निवेदन को अस्वीकार कर दिया जाता है तो प्रधानाध्यापक अनुपस्थिति को अनुचित रिकॉर्ड कर सकता है।

यात्रा

परिवारों को प्रोत्साहित किया जाता है कि वे स्कूल की छुट्टियों में यात्रा पर जाएँ। यदि स्कूल खुले होने के दौरान यात्रा जरूरी होती है तो इस बारे में अपने बच्चे के स्कूल के प्रधानाध्यापक से बात करें। लम्बी छुट्टी के लिए आवेदन करना (Application for Extended Leave) को पूरा करने की आवश्यकता हो सकती है। यात्रा के कारण अनुपस्थितियों को नामों की सूची में छुट्टी लिखा जाएगा, इसलिए यह आपकी कुल सालाना अनुपस्थितियों में जोडा जाएगा।

यदि यात्रा का समय स्कूल के 50 दिनों से अधिक होने जैसी कुछ स्थितियों में विद्यार्थी, पत्राचार द्वारा शिक्षा पाने के लिए उपयुक्त हो सकते हैं। इस बारे में अपने बच्चे के स्कूल के प्रधानाध्यापक से बात करनी चाहिए।





मेरा बच्चा स्कूल नहीं जाता है। मैं क्या कर सकता हूं?

समस्या के बारे में बात-चीत करने व मदद पाने के लिए आपको प्रधानाध्यापक से जल्द से जल्द संपर्क करना चाहिए। स्कूल उपस्थिति में सुधार करने में मदद के तरीकों में स्कूल के पढ़ाई व सहायता दल से मिलने के लिए रेफ़रल शामिल हो सकता है या आपके बच्चे को उचित सहायता नेटवर्कों से जोड़ा जा सकता है। उपस्थिति में सुधार योजना (Attendance Improvement Plan) का विकास करने के लिए प्रधानाध्यापक घर स्कूल संपर्क अधिकारी (Home School Liaison Program) से भी सहायता माँग सकता है।

यदि मेरे बच्चे की स्कूल अनुपस्थिति अस्वीकार्य स्तर पर जारी रहती है तो क्या हो सकता है?

यह समझना बहुत महत्वपूर्ण है कि शिक्षा विभाग के लिए आगे कार्यवाही करना ज़रूरी हो सकता है, जब स्कूल जाने की अनिवार्य आयु के बच्चों की स्कूल में बार-बार अस्पष्ट कारण से या अनुचित अनपस्थिति होती है।

निम्नलिखित में से कुछ कार्यवाहियाँ की जा सकती हैं:

• अनिवार्य रूप से स्कूल जाने संबंधी सभाएँ आपसे व आपके बच्चे से अनिवार्य रूप से स्कूल जाने संबंधी सभा में आने के लिए कहा जा सकता है। इस सभा में उन सहायताओं की पहचान की जाएगी जिनसे आपके बच्चे को नियमित रूप से स्कूल आने में मदद मिलेगी। आपके बच्चे को स्कूल में उपस्थित होने में मदद देने के लिए स्कूल, माता-पिता व एजेन्सियाँ साथ मिल कर सब के द्वारा स्वीकृत योजना [जिसे दायित्व (Undertakings) कहते हैं। का विकास करते हैं। अनिवार्य रूप से स्कूल जाने के आदेश के लिए बच्चों के न्यायालय में आवेदन करना

यदि आपके बच्चे की स्कूल में उपस्थिति असंतोषजनक रहती है तो विभाग बच्चों के न्यायालय में अनिवार्य रूप से स्कूल जाने के आदेश के लिए आवेदन कर सकता है। बच्चों के न्यायालय में मैजिस्ट्रेट अनिवार्य रूप से स्कूल जाने संबंधी सभा आयोजित करने का आदेश दे सकता है।

• स्थानीय न्यायालय में अभियोग लगाना

स्कूल व विभाग का स्टाफ़ आपके साथ मिल कर उन समस्याओं का समाधान करने के लिए वचनबद्ध है, जिनके कारण आपका बच्चा स्कूल में पूरी तरह हिस्सा नहीं ले पा रहा है। अनिवार्य रूप से स्कूल जाने के आदेश का उल्लंघन होने की स्थिति में माता या पिता के ख़िलाफ़ स्थानीय न्यायालय में आगे कार्यवाही की जा सकती है। न्यायालय की कार्यवाही का परिणाम सामुदायिक सेवा का आदेश या जुर्माना हो सकता है।

मेरा बच्चा किस आयु में स्कूल छोड़ सकता है?

सभी न्यू साऊथ वेल्ज़ के विद्यार्थियों के लिए Year 10 पूरा करना अनिवार्य है। Year 10 के बाद व जब तक वे 17 वर्ष की आयु के नहीं हो जाते, विद्यार्थियों को अपने स्कूल की पढ़ाई पूरी करने के लिए कई सुविधाजनक विकल्प हैं।

साझेदारी में काम करना

शिक्षा विभाग यह जानता है कि विद्यार्थियों का नियमित रूप से स्कूल जाने में सहायता करने का सबसे अच्छा तरीका है विद्यार्थियों व उनके परिवारों के साथ मिल कर काम करना।

हम आपके साथ मिल कर आपके बच्चे को उसके जीवन के अवसरों को पूरा करने में सहायता देने के इच्छुक हैं। यदि कोई विद्यार्थी स्कूल के सत्र में 8 दिन के थोड़े से समय के लिए अनुपस्थित होता है तो प्राईमरी स्कूल के अंत तक वह स्कूल से एक वर्ष के लिए अनुपस्थित होगा।







