I am extremely proud to be able to report we have our very own National swimming champ at Kent Road. Year Four student, Joshua, travelled to Hobart last week for the National Swimming Championships.

Last week Joshua competed in the Individual Medley, the relay, 50 metre backstroke, and the 50 metre butterfly.

Qualifying for the National Swimming Championships in one event is very special – qualifying in multiple events is something else!

But Joshua did not just qualify for the National Swimming Championships – he has won four medals and still has two events to go.

- Joshua received a silver medal in the individual medley.

Drama: We listened to the story of 'How The Birds Got Their Colours' and then acted it out with props.






This term in 1B and 1G we met Vince the Vibrant Visualiser. He is really cool!

Before we met Vince, we had to visualise what he looked like. Here are some of our drawings.














I'm as mysterious as a spy.







# Stage 3 Firestorm Showcase Invitation *Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> August (9:45am-10:30am)*

This Friday 3<sup>rd</sup> August, all parents and guardians are invited to attend Stage 3's Firestorm Showcase from 9:45am-10:30am in the School Hall.

Year 5 and Year 6 students have been developing their bushfire knowledge and STEM skills to answer the following driving question; *How can the Kent Road Community prepare for, survive and recover from a bushfire event?* In response to this question, students have empathised with witness testimonies of those affected by bushfires and the needs of the RFS, before defining and ideating solutions to the question by pinpointing problems to solve which would help our Kent Road community in a bushfire event. The unit has concluded with students creating a prototype of their final solution idea. These prototypes will be placed on display for parents, students and members of the Westleigh Rural Fire Service to view as part of the student-run showcase on Friday morning.

Our Year 5 and Year 6 students have worked hard throughout Term 2 to collaboratively brainstorm, negotiate, refine, design and create their prototype for display this week. They look forward to sharing their bushfire knowledge and STEM learning with an authentic audience this Friday.

# **Always Wear a Helmet!**

Research shows that helmets reduce head injuries by up to 74 per cent in crashes with motor vehicles. Wearing a helmet from the moment they start learning to ride will help your child to develop it as a habit and reduce the risk of head injuries.

Early helmet wearers will also be more likely to continue to wear helmets throughout their life.

Your child must wear a helmet when riding a bike in a public place. It is the law. It is important that the helmet is correctly fitted and complies with the Australian and New Zealand Standards. A helmet that is not correctly fitted and fastened does not provide enough protection in a crash.

# Choosing and using a helmet

Always choose an approved helmet with a standards approved sticker.

Pick a helmet with a bright colour so it can easily be seen.

Choose the right size so it doesn't cover your eyes or ears.

Look for a light weight helmet with adjustable straps and fitting system.

Avoid attaching anything to the helmet.

Never wear a damaged helmet.

The Centre for Road Safety website has detailed information on **selecting and fitting helmets**.



At school, your child will learn about road safety as part of Personal Development, Health and Physical Education. Help them learn safety on wheels messages by using and sharing them whenever you are riding together.

- 1. Visit scholastic.com.au/LOOP.
- 2. Follow the instructions to register or sign in, place your order and make payment using your credit card.
- 5. When your LOOP order is completed, you're done, there is no need to fill out and return the order form to school!
- 6. You can also download the LOOP app for iOS or Android devices.


