Principal's Report

I would like to thank all teachers for their collective effort last week to ensure the success of a number of wonderful events and initiatives which provided opportunities for students to demonstrate their learning, develop new skills and have fun. I hope you enjoy the images of these events which are included in the newsletter.

STEM CAR RACE

It is now only one week before our STEM Car Race Day Challenge on Monday 13th August.

Car designs may be complex or simple. I encourage everyone to have a go and join in the fun!

YEAR FIVE and SIX STEM PROJECT

We were delighted to welcome several members of the NSW Rural Fire Service (RFS) to the school last Friday as well as Mrs Barbara Ryan, Deputy Principal from St Ives North Public School for the conclusion of the STEM project which our Year Five and Six students have been involved with over the past three months.

Our students have been mentored by the RFS as they researched bushfire prevention and developed their big ideas including early detection of bushfires and early warning systems using drones and sensors; protective clothing; and using robots to identify the heat source.

The RFS and Mrs Ryan, who has been a mentor to our teachers through the STEM ACTION RESEARCH PROJECT, were highly impressed by the depth of knowledge and understanding our students demonstrated, as was I. The level of knowledge demonstrated by our students was matched by their level of engagement, and our assembly hall was buzzing with an energy that was palpable.

Thank you to the parents and grandparents who attended the showcase, and provided the students an audience for their ideas. Thank you for listening to not only your own child but to the ideas of many students. I am sure you would have been impressed by the depth of knowledge and commitment every student demonstrated.

This is an example of project based learning, where students work in groups to follow a design process to develop their ideas, test them and then modify or redevelop solutions to real world problems. The process fosters students' skills in collaboration, communication, critical thinking and creativity, all essential skills needed for young people entering into the workforce in the future. Thank you teachers, Miss Sheridan, Ms Brasier, Mrs Prins, Miss Grealy, Miss Ison, Ms Grysiewicz and Miss Rogers for the outstanding guidance you provided your students in this unit of work.

I'm up to my tenth lap!!


K-6 WALKATHON

Many volunteers removed rubbish (broken concrete and building rubbish) which had been dumped in the Blue Gum Forest and a lot of weeding was done. The next step for this area will be mulching and planting native ground cover plants. We got to pat some the animals, some even wanted a hug.






Term Three Week 3

This term year one have been participating in various drama activities. Drama club has begun and students have started to rehearse their first script in pairs. This short skit is comedic and all about the punch line in the end!

We have also participated in a Dreamtime play to celebrate NAIDOC week. Students acted as birds in How the Birds Got Their Colours. There was a surly crow, a helpful parrot and other friendly birds.

The next drama activity we performed was Possum Magic written by Mem Fox. Some students acted as Grandma Poss who made bush magic



and some students acted as Hush, the young possum who was turned invisible. Students needed to think of their own creative solution to turn Hush visible again.

As part of NAIDOC week, 2W researched the Ryde area for Wallumedegal people who were the traditional owners of the land in our area. For generations, they were fisher-hunter-gatherers in a rich environment of river flats, mangrove swamps and creeks. Wallumedegal comes from *wallumai*, meaning <u>snapper (fish)</u>





This term Year Three are all about robots! In English, we are reading The Wild Robot by Peter Brown. This exciting story follows a robot who has ended up on an island and is learning to understand and communicate with other animals. Year Three will follow the writing process to construct a narrative about robots.

In Science, to follow our robot theme Year Three are experimenting with robotics using the WeDo software. 3L and 3M students had a lot of fun working together to create a car robot. They used iPads to build and program their robots. Once finished, groups raced against each other and cheered their robot cars on to READY SET GO!

It was so rewarding to see these two grades standing side by side in confidence to display their bushfire knowledge, understanding and design thinking skills to our Kent Road community.

These prototypes are just a selection of the physical and digital products collaboratively created in response to the stage's driving question; How can the Kent Road Community prepare for, survive and recover from a bushfire event?

The collaborative relationship offered from these community role models was irreplaceable and highly appreciated from all teachers and students. Mufti Day: Monday 13th August 2018



BAND PROGRAM



Are you thinking about joining the band program? We will soon be seeking interest from students in Years 2-5 for 2019.

How does it work?

Students are given the opportunity to try an instrument in Term 4 of 2018 (through weekly instrumental lessons) before deciding if they'd like to join the Junior Band in 2019. Weekly instrumental tuition is compulsory for all band students. To decide on which instrument you will play, we will conduct blow tests at the end of Term 3 to determine which instrument will suit you best. We also take into account your instrument preferences.

Where/when do I have my weekly instrumental lessons?

Lessons occur before or after school in classrooms.

Do I need prior musical experience?

No, anyone can join the band, regardless of if you already play an instrument or not.

How much does it cost?

Weekly GROUP lessons (3 students per group) cost \$20 per student for 30 mins. Weekly individual lessons usually cost around \$30-35 per student for 30 mins. If you join the band in 2019, further band fees will apply.

What instruments can I choose from?

Flute, clarinet, saxophone, trumpet, trombone, baritone horn, keyboard, percussion, bass guitar, percussion (drum kit, glockenspiel and extra percussion).

Where can I hire an instrument?

You will be able to hire an instrument from the school. If you wish to buy an instrument, we recommend In Tune Music shop or Turramurra Music shop.

What do I need to commit to?

Band students need to be committed to weekly lessons, home practice, taking care of their instrument and being punctual to band rehearsals.

Why join the band?

Playing in a band can contribute to a student's development of team spirit, self-esteem, social interaction, self-discipline and responsibility. Plus, it's a lot of fun!

What do I need to do now?

Keep a look-out for a note soon regarding expressions of interest.
