INDERGARTEN NEWS

Matt Stanton - Character Drawing

KL took on Matt Stanton's approach to building a character of their own. In pairs, the students asked questions about what their character should have (big nose or small nose), then it was up to their interpretation of how they drew the character. They turned out great!!

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YEAR ONE NEWS This term Year One has been using their amazing imaginations to write creative stories! We have been using a narrative scaffold to structure our stories – orientation, complication and solution. We have been focusing on paragraphing and interesting sentence starters.

The first text we read was "Stuck" by Oliver Jeffers. Students needed to create their own characters and their problem was to be based around someone or something getting stuck!













Year Two prepared presentations of different countries. Many of the students presented on Japan. Inspired by these talks we decided to do an artwork with a Japanese theme. Jaime presented a talk on how to make an origami kimino and a crane, so she taught the class how to fold one to put in our artwork. We looked at the artworks of Kawase Hasui who paints bridges and blossoms in many of his works. We put a lady in a kimino standing by the bridge.

Environmentors

On Monday, Year Three were lucky enough to have an incursion from a company called Environmentors. Year Three discovered what litter does to our environment and how it can stop us from enjoying it. We discovered different types of litter and how microplastics end up in the fish we eat! We looked at our own litter behaviours and how to change them. We also discovered all the harmful things litter can cause like floods, fires and illness to people and animals. We also saw what happened to a model town when litter gets spread from the rain.

The main message of the incursion was to make sure your rubbish is in the bin properly and pick up other rubbish if you see it on the ground. We don't want rubbish around to wash into our water systems and destroy marine life.













Year 6 Excursion to Canberra

Last Wednesday students in Year 6 arrived at school early to attend their excursion to Canberra. We had our first stop in Goulburn for morning tea where students stretched their legs and played some games before returning to the bus bound for Canberra. A lunch stop at Mount Ainsley allowed students to view Canberra from the lookout and see the following day's destinations of Parliament House and the War Memorial from above.

We soon arrived at the Australian Institute of Sport in the afternoon for a tour of the sporting grounds including the volleyball courts, swimming pool and gymnasium. The use of rigorous training and technological input was explained to students who enjoyed seeing where our Australian athletes work out and train. It was clear there are many athletes in

the making at Kent Road when students entered the Sportex, an interactive sporting experience for students to try out Skiing, Football, Basketball, Cycling, the Skeleton Run, Rowing and Wheelchair Racing. After our energising AIS experience, we travelled to our accommodation at the Ibis Eagle Hawk where we split into cabins before enjoying dinner, trivia games and a movie.

Another early start on Thursday was the beginning of an action packed and very full day. Arriving at the War Memorial after walking along Anzac Parade, students toured the exhibits, experienced a wreath laying ceremony led by Zoe, Ty, Nick and Sophie, listened to facts and stories about soldiers and veterans and remembered the sacrifice of all ANZACs for Australia. A quick bus ride took us to Parliament House where one of our Kent Road

groups were greeted by our Federal Member for Bennelong, Mr John Alexander. He spoke to students about his career and answered many questions put forward about current political situations by our students. After this, Year 6 participated in a role play of passing a

bill before watching the House of Representatives prior to Question Time. We then visited then Electoral Education Centre to learn about voting in Australia before strolling through the rose gardens opposite Old Parliament House. We returned to our accommodation for dinner and then were back on the bus headed to the Australian National Botanic Gardens.

A night tour searching for traces of animal life within the gardens provided glimpses of kangaroos, tawny frogmouths, possums, frogs and a variety of other wildlife. After an exciting, educational and tiring day we returned to our cabins for a good night's sleep.

The final day of our excursion began with a visit to Questacon. Many students enjoyed the free fall where they climbed a staircase to an exciting drop of about 6 metres onto a slide. Science experiments, building activities and light, sound and tactile galleries provided the chance for students to explore scientific ideas in a hands-on and interactive way. We waved goodbye to Canberra after a lunch break outside Questacon and were back on the bus bound for Sydney.

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion, the Australian Government has contributed funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs. This rebate has already been deducted, reducing the total cost charged to parents.

Thank you to our Year 6 students for representing Kent Road so well during your excursion. There were many comments about your respectful behaviour, curious questions and insightful responses which all contributed to creating a very enjoyable camp experience for all.





















They're counting on you



On average, more than five children are killed and 47 seriously injured in driveways each year across Australia.

In NSW, six children have been killed and 15 seriously injured in driveways since January 2013.

We all have a role to play when it comes to driveway safety.

Your young child counts on you to **supervise** them near vehicles, **separate** play areas from driveways and **see** where they are at all times.

Remember to:

Supervise

When your child is around driveways, they should be actively supervised by an adult who is holding their hand. Ensure that young children are placed securely in a vehicle before moving it.

Separate

Treat the driveway like a road. Do not let your child use the driveway as a play area. Separate play spaces from garages and driveways. Home features including fences, high handles on garage doors and self-closing doors or gates can help.

All vehicles have blind spots. Even though reversing sensors and cameras can help reduce blind spots, it can still be hard to see a small child until it is too late. Do not become complacent. Get into the habit of walking around your vehicle before starting it, especially when leaving an area where a young child could be present.
